Making Sense of New Workplace Data Streams and Al

Aligning HR, IT and Real Estate to break down silos, apply intelligent analytics and measure real impact remains a major challenge. Occupancy measurements and workplace analytics are proving to be powerful tools for enabling strategic decisions and delivering significant cost savings. Over the past three years, Telia Company has reduced its office footprint from six buildings to two in an ambitious transformation aligned with the shift to hybrid work and a renewed focus on employee experience. In this session, Asma Zahid, Head of PMO Group Real Estate at Telia, will share how the company moved beyond traditional person-to-desk ratios to embrace true activity-based working. She will outline the journey from manual entry and exit data collection to a recent proof-of-concept with digital occupancy measurement tools and how this data informed real estate strategy and space optimisation.


